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## SASQUATCH - THE LEGACY CONTINUES

On February 10, 2006, the current Glen Hay Falconer Foundation Brewing Scholarship recipients brewed a special beer at Walking Man Brewing to raise funds to support future brewing scholarships. Barney Brennan of Full Sail Brewing, Jenn Gridley of Fish Brewing, and Markus Stinson of Elysian Brewing collaborated on recipe for the inaugural "Sasquatch Legacy Project" beer, an Imperial Red Ale.

The Sasquatch Legacy Project is the brainchild of Bob Craig of Walking Man Brewing in Stevenson, Washington. Craig conceived the brilliant idea of bringing together the Foundation Brewing Scholarship recipients to create a new recipe and brew their beer at Walking Man. Great Western Malting and Hopunion donated ingredients. Craig's distributors, Point Blank Distributing and Superior Beer Distribution, and the many participating publicans are supporting the Foundation's brewing scholarship program with generous donations.

On March 24, 2006, the Horse Brass Pub hosted a release party that was attended by crowds of beer lovers all in support of brewing excellence and education. The Bier Stein in Eugene also held an event the same evening. In April, the 21<sup>st</sup> Amendment Brewery, Rogue San Francisco Public House, and The Bistro each threw separate fundraising parties around the Imperial Red, representing the first Foundation events in California.

For a limited time, the "Sasquatch Legacy Project" Imperial Red Ale is available at select pubs in Oregon, Washington, and California, including the Horse Brass Pub, Oaks Bottom Pub, and Concordia Ale House in Portland, The Bier Stein in Eugene, Beveridge Place Pub, and Elysian Brewing in Seattle, Fish Bowl Pub in Olympia, 21<sup>st</sup> Amendment Brewery and The Bistro in San Francisco Bay area, Rogue Pubs in Issaquah, San Francisco, and Newport, and, of course Walking Man in Stevenson, Washington.

As described by the brewers: "The Imperial Red Ale is a hophead's delight. Not overly bitter, a wonderful citrusy hop zing greets your nose and palate to balance out the malt. Don't be fooled by the smoothness, its 8% ABV!"

Enjoy a pint or two of this special beer and, while you appreciate its flavors and complexities, know that you are also supporting brewing knowledge and expertise by supporting the Foundation's brewing scholarship program.
