Asher Sun: Asher followed his true passion shifting from a background in engineering to pursue a career in craft brewing industry. That journey literally took him from his Taiwan home country to the US. Asher continues to contribute to the Taiwan craft beer community – he is a co-founder of the Taiwanese Brewer's Association and helps organize the Taiwan Craft Beer Conferences. In Taiwan, he has worked as lead brewer at Ugly Half Beer. In the US, Asher has worked as lead brewer at Drake's Brewing and is currently a brewer at pFriem Family Brewers where he had contributed meaningfully to process optimization. When not in the brewhouse, Asher can be found giving back to the beer community as a judge at competitions, posting on his beer blog, and reaching out via his podcast.

After several years there, Jamie worked as a production brewer at Dragoon Brewing before moving to Deschutes Brewery. Each of these positions brought new learning experiences and demonstrated Jamie's desire to learn and contribute to her brewery team and educate the public on beer styles.
